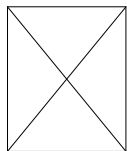
In a few weeks the Keldermans' moving experience will end but our journey with all of you will just begin. May our journey together be one of grace and peace and love.

## DIOCESAN CONVENTION HIGHLIGHTS

Our Diocesan Convention was at Bucknell University again this year. It began Friday, June 8 and concluded Saturday, June 9, with worship services at the beginning and end. I have been

attending convention for over thirty years and this convention had the shortest business session ever! Some areas that I want to share with you are:

**Friday Business Session:** During this time we were introduced to the diocesan staff; conducted elections for Standing Committee, Council of Trustees, and Ecclesiastical Trial Court and voted on the budget. There were no resolutions to consider (this was a first for me) and only one report from a diocesan committee. Mississippi Bishop Duncan Gray gave a moving presentation on the Katrina clean-up efforts in his diocese.

**A summary of Bishop Baxter's address** to convention is on the diocesan website [www.diocesepa.org](http://www.diocesepa.org). In addition to what is in the summary, he included in his remarks on:

- **Human Sexuality:** He said he supports those in same-sex, committed relationships and legislation that would allow for civil unions in PA. If approved by the National Church Bishop Baxter will support the Blessing of same-sex unions in our diocese. He recommended that we avail ourselves of the "Communion Matters" materials from the National Church to aid in our discussion on human sexuality.
- **Budget:** We are facing a budget deficit of \$150,000 which is due to the low Fair Share receipts which are 83% of the budget. Several staff positions have been eliminated and programs cut in an attempt to balance the budget. 40% of our churches do not meet their Fair Share amount. He requested that every congregation honor their Fair Share.
- **Outreach:** Bishop Baxter reaffirmed our Companion Diocese relationship with the Diocese of Sao Paulo who sent two representatives to the convention, one of whom (Eric Mercer) spent two days with us in Gettysburg. Our diocese made a two-year financial commitment to Casa Dia drug rehabilitation program in Sao Paulo. We agreed to help fund the position of Clinical Director. Bishop Baxter said every congregation in our diocese will be asked to contribute \$300-500 to that end. He also thanked the nearly 300 volunteers from our churches who helped with the Katrina disaster clean-up in Mississippi.
- **Stewardship and Evangelism:** Bishop Baxter named these as priorities for the next year, saying they are connected. We were asked to "Lay all of our life (time, talent, treasure) before God;" to experience the joys of serving Him; and focus on justice issues.

**Workshops:** Some very worthwhile workshops were presented. I attended one on our Companion Diocese; John

attended an Endowment presentation and Hal attended a workshop on Archives, presented by Jennifer Railing. We will be glad to share the information with you.

There were many more highlights that I will be glad to share them with you. Just ask!

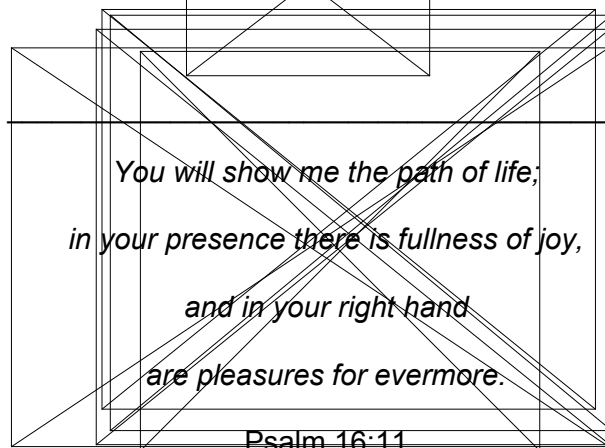
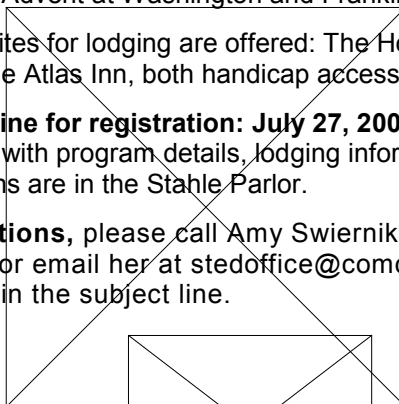

## CROP WALK 2007, FINAL REPORT

We had a successful walk with 66 walkers and amount raised to date, \$ 3,976.00 plus \$100.00 raised on line to give a sub-total so far of \$ 4,076.00. We have asked for a matching grant from Thrivent so anticipate that our final total will be greater. Only one person set up a web page this year earning \$100. This was a disappointment as the e-mails recorded as sent by the web page were never received by the addressees.

We followed the format of last year for our walk. The opening and registration were at Trinity UCC. The walk progressed from there to the College Track. Pastor Lou Nyiri had a great relay arranged. From there we returned to the Presbyterian Church for our closing activities. Pastor Patrick Walker had two competitions, World Basketball and World Volleyball for the children. Refreshments (pizza, cookies, apples, and water) were served. Pastor Lou Nyiri handed out some prizes. Thanks were expressed to all who participated, especially to Marica Poroza, our former refugee, now a US citizen, to Pastor Nyiri, Pastor Patrick Walker, all the members of our committee and to Barry Kunkel and June Nyblade, co-chairs.

June Nyblade announced her retirement from the co-chair position. Next year the Crop Walk will be moved to the fall season and combined with The World Hunger Day in mid-October, 2008.

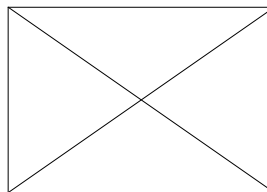
## STEPHEN MINISTRY AND STEPHEN MINISTERS

Under the auspices of Lutheran Social Services, ten Stephen Ministers representing seven mainline churches and four denominations were commissioned in June 2007 in Gettysburg.

This transdenominational, caregiving ministry allows congregations to reach out to more people with one-to-one Christian care. Before commissioning, these Stephen Ministers underwent training in Christian caregiving skills, covering topics such as active listening, feelings, confidentiality, crisis theory, as well as ministering to specific situations such as grief, depression, loneliness, divorce, hospitalization, chronic illness, and unemployment. They are now prepared to do Stephen Ministry.

After they begin providing one-to-one care, Stephen Ministers will continue to meet twice a month with their Stephen Leaders for continuing education and supervision.

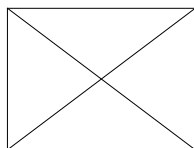

### NURSERY VOLUNTEERS

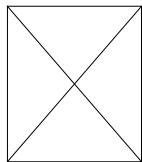
